The real cost of Holistic Security

- → People: Skills shortages, burnout, 24x7 expectations
- → Processes: Complexity, duplication, alert fatigue
- → **Technology:** Tool sprawl, integration gaps
- → Hidden costs: Shadow IT, poor readiness, blind spots



Outsourcing fears

What is holding you back?

- → Loss of visibility or control
- → Responsiveness and service quality
- → Alignment to goals and culture
- → Trust, transparency, and security of the MSSP itself



The Wake-Up Call – Recent Attacks



M&S attack:

→ Timing and visibility failures



Co-op attack:

→ Third-party vulnerability impact



Lessons:

→ Supply chain risk, proactive response



Managing the supply chain risk

- → How many vendors touch your data?
- → How well do you monitor them?
- → Do you have early-warning capabilities?




Choosing the right partner
